What is CIAD ?

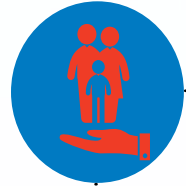
CIAD (International Commission for Aid and Development) provides financial help to countries where the Society of Saint Vincent de Paul has a presence.

This may be humanitarian aid, in the case of natural or human disasters (emergency help after earthquake, reconstruction after a storm), or development aid (systemic change in the form of micro-credit or long-term projects). It helps to expand the Society in various countries.

The Commission is formed of a team of volunteers and employees, and meets every 6 months to study requests for funding aid from the countries. Its funds come mainly from donations contributed by member countries, either spontaneously or following an appeal from the International Council General.

CIAD always tries to respect the wishes of the donors. All the funds are allocated to the projects financed.
